Hello adults! It's ok for us to:

Stand back — let children take the lead in what they are doing and how they organise themselves.

See how the children get on — observing children's play helps us to understand their strengths, preferences, what they are working on and how they problem solve.

Lend a hand if they want us to — we can offer help when a child asks or when we see a child needing help. This may be help to make something or asking questions to help problem solve.

Ask for help too — if we ask when we're not sure how to do something or need help, it shows children how they can get help too.

Step in if needed - we can all help to keep areas safe.

Before interrupting children's play, consider if they are managing risks and how you can support children to solve any problems.

Make something too - some children may need help to get started. It's ok for us to join in and offer ideas, then stand back when they are ready.

Tell them they are brilliant! - share what you have noticed, what children have achieved and how they achieved it.
